

THREE REGIONS COOPERATE TO SUPPORT NUTREVENT, A KEY EUROPEAN EVENT FOR HEALTH & NUTRITION INNOVATION

The 6th edition of NutrEvent will be held in Rennes on October 22 and 23, 2019.

NutrEvent is a partnering event that focuses on innovation in food, feed, nutrition and health. Eurasanté and the Nutrition Health and Longevity (NHL) Cluster have hosted the event in Lille since 2009. NutrEvent is now at the heart of a unique partnership between three major French ecosystems in the industry: Bretagne, Pays de la Loire and Hauts-de-France. This special agreement between NHL cluster, Valorial, Atlanpole Biotherapies, Eurasanté, Atlanpole technology cluster, the technological innovation centre ID2Santé, and the local authorities of the three regions will allow NutrEvent to expand its base, and the event will alternately be hosted by Lille, Rennes and Nantes on an annual basis. NutrEvent fosters the dynamic between industry and academic stakeholders, and continues its trajectory towards becoming the leading European event in nutrition & health innovation.

An annual event to foster the sector's development

NutrEvent is a key event for European B2B meetings between ingredient suppliers and distributors, finished food product industries, food supplement industries, academic stakeholders, technology transfer organisations, research institutes R&D consulting firms, and investors. NutrEvent's position as the key platform for new R&D and innovation partnering opportunities has steadily developed since 2009. Its goal is to contribute to innovative product and service development in the food, health and nutrition industries.

Nutrition & Food – a major industry in France

Nutrition & Food is a major industry in France and in the regions involved. It represents over 185 billion euros of the national economy and over 10% of total exports. Multi-nationals, SMEs, and start-ups are developing innovation and R&D projects in this area. Support from ambitious public and private investment policies allows food businesses to innovate in every area. These innovations are often the result of partnerships between academic and industrial stakeholders, and NutrEvent provides them with the framework they need to meet and enter into these partnerships that lead to new projects.

The annualisation of NutrEvent will allow its 600 participants, who come from about twenty countries, to increase their interactions, thereby significantly increasing partnership opportunities.

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Alternation between Brittany, Hauts-de-France, and Pays de la Loire to strengthen NutrEvent's positioning and broaden its outreach to achieve innovation

Hauts-de-France

For its first five editions, NutrEvent depended on the NHL Cluster (a French competitiveness cluster positioned at the intersection of nutrition and health) to bring together leading nutrition innovators, including Lesaffre, Roquette, Ingredia, Cargill, Ajinomoto Foods Europe, DSM and Olygose which are all big names in the functional food industry with their head offices in the Hauts-de-France region.

Grand Ouest

By opening itself up to the Grand Ouest region, one of the Europe's leading agri-food and agricultural economic hubs with over 2,500 agri-food and nutrition businesses and an academia geared towards research and training in life sciences and health/nutrition, NutrEvent will provide participants with new partnering opportunities and business development possibilities.

The west of France is lucky enough to be the home to a number of European and international leaders in the industry. These include companies in most of agri-food areas (e.g. Bigard-Charal, LDC, Even, Sodebo, Fleury Michon, Agrial, Diana Food, D'aucy, Lactalis, Pasquier, and Triballat), research stakeholders and major schools and universities (e.g. Agrocampus Ouest, ANSES, INRA, INSERM, ONIRIS), the Carnot AgriFoodTransition platform, technology transfer centres (CBB Capbiotek and ID2Santé), and technical centres (e.g. Act Food Brittany Federation of agri- and agro-technical centres, CTCPA, TECALIMA,). The Nutrition Technocampus in Nantes, which brings together all of the economic, academic, and technical stakeholders in the agri-food business and the nutritional innovation cluster that is grouped in Rennes around the Contemporary Culinary Centre is another asset.

Opening up to animal health/nutrition with the aim of 'One Health'

The 6th NutrEvent is the first time that animal health/nutrition is featured. This is one of the Grand Ouest's strong points. The idea behind the 'One Health' concept is that animal, plant, and human health are all inter-related. The connections between animal and human nutrition are real and the subject of increasing R&D investment, totalling 14% of all Agribusiness expenses last year. Animal feed stakeholders, which are also active in the human nutrition industry, are coming together around shared concerns (they represent a 12.8 million euros in the French economy). Functional foods are strengthening their position in animal nutrition, within a framework where health/nutrition is perceived as being the way forward to improve zootechnical performance (resistance to infection, fertility, etc.). The use of pre- and pro-biotics helps modulate animal microbiota and can be an alternative to antibiotics in livestock, which has a positive

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impact on human health. Over the past five years, this dynamic has contributed to reducing the use of veterinary antibiotics by 37%.

“Animal health/nutrition is a real focus for the members of our network. In fact, the issue drove us to submit, along with the NHL Cluster, a European Interreg project on the subject. Atlanpole Biotherapies members are also committed, in the same way as those of the NHL Cluster, to researching microbiota and the way they interact with health. Nutrition plays a key role when it comes to this issue and the various research projects being conducted by the stakeholder in our network change our outlook on things every day. NutrEvent participants will find everything they need to enter into new fruitful partnerships in the blooming innovation ecosystem of the Grand Ouest.” Jean-François Balducchi, Executive Officer of Atlanpole and Associate Vice President of the Atlanpole Biotherapies cluster.
